What to Expect in an Advising Meeting

When meeting with the Graduate Office, you can expect us to do the following:

Listen

Practice active listening to help identify goals and barriers to success and collaborate to develop a plan to meet those goals.

Understand

Work together to understand the rules and regulations set by the University and identify the best resources and on-campus services that can help support student academic success.

Empower

Encourage and empower students to use their understanding of the University and its resources to make confident decisions for their own academic careers.

How to Schedule and Prepare for an Advising Meeting

To schedule an appointment with the Graduate Administrator at the School of the Environment, please email <u>graduate.office.env@utoronto.ca</u>. We encourage students to meet with their advisor as early as possible and as frequently as needed to ensure they feel supported and prepared for their academic year.

To prepare for the meeting, please consider the following:

- Review the <u>School of Graduate Studies Calendar</u>, <u>Sessional Dates</u> and Degree Program Requirements (<u>MES</u>, <u>Collaborative Specialization in Environmental Studies</u>, <u>Collaborative</u> <u>Specialization in Environment and Health</u>).
- Attend the meeting prepared with questions and/or concerns related to issues affecting your academic career.
- Ask questions for clarification and work with your advisor to ensure your appointment supports your academic needs.

- 1. How to develop a course timetable that supports your program requirements and interests.
- 2. Contacting services at the University (i.e., Accessibility Services, Student Life, Housing Services).
- 3. How to understand University policies and procedures.
