The MES is an intensive, 12-month research-stream program that responds to the growing need of society to understand and develop solutions to the environmental and human wellbeing challenges facing us in the 21st century.

Master of Environment & Sustainability

The first research-based environmental master's program at U of T, the MES program provides a transdisciplinary perspective on environmental issues. Problem-focused, rather than disciplinefocused, students learn to connect science with policy, social science and humanities. The small, intimate cohort-based program gives students the opportunity to work closely with

faculty.

Each MES student specializes in one of four concentrations (listed on the right). Concentrations serve as a guide to understanding School of the Environment graduate courses.







Rootbound: combining law, policy, research, organizing, and storytelling to inoculate youth against climate despair

Rootbound is a gripping young adult climate fantasy novel bursting with hope, heart, adventure, and mystery (think Greta Thunberg x Percy Jackson). Dr. Grace Nosek drew from her PhD research on climate misinformation + democracy and her postdoctoral research on inoculating youth against climate despair, in addition to almost a decade as a youth climate organizer, to write Rootbound.
